Become a photographer:

- Choose a theme to create a series of photos on, for example insects, buildings, colours, weather, food, characters, logos...
- Tell a story through photographs.
- Go on a 'photowalk' somewhere fun or interesting, taking pictures to illustrate the route or the highlights.



Become a journalist:

- Look at some magazines and see how they lay out the pages, and what kind of articles they include. Choose your own style and content, and create one that reflects your interests to inspire others.
- Instead of a magazine you could be a news reporter for a newspaper or online news website. Write your own report on something that is currently in the news. Research it well to give an unbiased viewpoint.



Become an architect:

- There is some amazing architecture in the world! Research different examples of awesome buildings and make a project booklet from them. You could review each one, discussing the ideas behind it, its location, use, and give your own opinion on it.
- Or you could use these ideas to create your own example of amazing architecture, and include the above pieces of information (even though it is currently only in your imagination!).



Become a travel writer:

- Choose a fascinating place in the world that you have either visited, or would love to visit. Research it well and then write a review on it to inspire other people to visit it. Include some history, the best places to go, and very importantly, the food you can eat there!



Become a wildlife expert:

- Learn from the master: Sir David Attenborough. There are always lots of his amazing programmes available on BBC iPlayer... choose one and be amazed at the world around us.
- You could review the programme or do some additional research to make a factfile about one of the animals from the episode you watch.
