Spring 1	<p>Who was the biggest threat to the Plantagenet monarchs?</p>	<p>A study of how power shifted during the period 1154-1485, considering the role and importance of the church in the study of the murder of Thomas Beckett, the signing of the Magna Carta and its significance on royal authority, and the importance of the Peasants' Revolt and the 100 years war for royal power.</p>	<p>Essay on who was the greater threat to the Plantagenet monarchs: the church, the peasants or the nobility?</p>
Spring 2	<p>Why is the Middle East so historically significant?</p>	<p>Why civilisations developed in the Middle East. Case study on Baghdad and what makes it a significant city.</p>	<p>Mini essay explaining the significance of Baghdad.</p>
Summer 1	<p>Were the Crusades really holy wars?</p>	<p>A study of the Crusades and a look at the historical debate surrounding the extent to which they were fought for religious reasons.</p>	<p>Essay evaluating interpretations on the Crusades</p>
Summer 2	<p>What kind of change was the Reformation</p>	<p>Why did the Reformation start in Europe and how did it manifest in England. Source analysis to uncover what mattered more to Henry VIII at the time of the Reformation: money, power or religion?</p>	<p>Source analysis</p>
